

Trachycarpus "Wagnerianus"



The *Trachycarpus fortunei* 'Wagnerianus' discovered by Albert Wagner in Japan, probably has horticultural origin or according to other botanists is a real species native to the Japanese Alps.

Very elegant and with aristocratic forms this cultivar or species of *Trachycarpus* is easily identifiable due to the shorter and more rigid leaves, almost circular when young, hemispherical in adult plants. The palm reaches 9-10 meters in height and 10-25 cm in diameter, it has a noticeably slower growth than the *T. fortunei*. More resistant to cold winds.

It is the palm that goes further north, withstanding temperatures of - 20 ° C, with cases recorded even of - 25 ° C, in perfectly acclimatized plants.
